Upon successful completion of the Programme you will:

- be fully equipped with both theoretical knowledge (in social anthropology, history, sociology, political science, international relations, economics, and law) and practical skills to pursue a career in the field of migration
- learn to use contemporary methods of collecting and analyzing both qualitative and quantitative data
- have a good command of foreign languages of your choice
- be able to combine critical, analytic and holistic perspectives in your future work

Career opportunities

There is a variety of career paths to follow upon graduation. The professional training received in the programme can be applied at national, regional or local government bodies, think tanks, consultancy and analytics services, educational and research as well as other organizations dealing with migration and migration-related issues, and at international non-governmental and governmental organizations. You will also be able to proceed to a doctoral degree if you choose to.

To study in the programme, you will need to have a good command of the English and Russian languages corresponding to levels of at least B2 (CEFR) and TRKI-2 respectively. Certificates of attainment are welcomed but not required. What matters is your actual language competence that you will be expected to demonstrate during entrance examinations.
